Ash Wednesday Service – March 6, 7 p.m.

An excerpt from the Companion to the Book of Common Worship (Geneva Press, 2003, 109-110)

The Lenten journey from the ashes of death to resurrected life begins on the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday, which signifies a time to turn around, to change directions, to repent. This first day of Lent reminds us that unless we are willing to die to our old selves, we cannot be raised to new life with Christ. The first step of this journey calls us to acknowledge and confront our mortality, individually and corporately.

Ashes on the forehead is a sign of our humanity and a reminder of our mortality. The ashes are a reminder to us and our communities of our finite creatureliness. The ashes we wear on our Lenten journey symbolize the dust and broken debris of our lives as well as the reality that eventually each of us will die.

During the imposition of ashes the words “You are dust, and to dust you shall return” (Genesis 3:19) are repeated again and again. On Ash Wednesday, we begin our Lenten trek through the desert toward Easter. Our Lenten journey is one of metanoia (“turning around”), of changing directions from self-serving toward the self-giving way of the cross.

We hope to see you at our Ash Wednesday service for the imposition of ashes as well as partaking in communion.

PCN's New Head of Staff and Pastor



Dr. Adam Smith currently serves in Dallas Center, Iowa as the senior pastor at First Presbyterian Church. He has been with his current congregation since 2010. Prior to his current church, Adams served from 2008 to 2010 at Memorial Presbyterian Church in St. Augustine, Florida as the Director of Youth and College Ministry. From 2006 to 2008, Adam was the Music Director at Grace Presbyterian Church in Round Rock, Texas. From 2003 to 2005 Adam was the Youth Director at First Presbyterian Church in Greenville, Illinois.

Adam was ordained in January 2011. Dr. Smith earned his Doctorate in Ministry, focused on church revitalization, in 2018 from McCormick Seminary in Chicago. He earned his Master's in Divinity from Austin Seminary in 2008. Adam attended Greenville College and earned a BS in Contemporary Christian Music. Adam grew up and attended school in Fort Worth, Texas.

Adam is married to Sarah, an elementary school music teacher and ice-skating coach. They have three children: son Aaron, age 12; daughter Kaydence, age 11; and son Zachary, age 8.

My family and I are so blessed to have the opportunity to partner with the church community at the Presbyterian Church of Novato. The last four months have been a wonderful process of prayer and discernment, and we are both humbled and excited to begin a new chapter of ministry together!

I am a Texas native who spent my childhood in Fort Worth. I am a cradle Presbyterian who has always been active in the church. I attended Greenville University in Illinois where I completed a bachelor's degree in Contemporary Christian Music, and where I met my beautiful bride, Sarah. After graduating from college, as newlyweds we moved to Austin, Texas where I began studying at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. During this time, we welcomed our son, Aaron, in 2006, and then our daughter, Kaydence, in 2008.

We continued our ministry journey after seminary in St. Augustine, Florida where I served as the Director of Youth and College Ministries at Memorial Presbyterian Church. During our time in Florida, we welcomed the birth of our youngest child, Zachary, in 2010.

Yet, God still had other plans for us. I felt the call to pastoral ministry with a renewed clarity. In late 2010, I accepted a call as solo pastor at First Presbyterian Church in Dallas Center, Iowa. I have been serving as their head pastor since that time.

In my years at Dallas Center, FPC grew in membership and became more diverse as we welcomed young families into our fold. FPC went through a process of Visioning and Strategic Planning that resulted in a more concrete vision and mission for our changing congregation. FPC installed new audio/visual equipment throughout the worship spaces and all classrooms; created a children's Sunday School program from the ground up; created a growing and thriving youth ministry program; created a volunteer music worship team (band); and built a stage area in the sanctuary. FPC's budget grew every year, and mission investments both local and international continued to grow. We became the highest-giving congregation to our Presbytery general mission fund (per our size). We went through a discernment process leading to the expansion of our church facilities (renovating education spaces, building a new fellowship hall and certified, commercial

kitchen). Ground will be broken on the new construction in March of 2019. I worked to help create an annual service auction that raises \$5,000-\$8,000 per year for the local Ministerial Association Benevolence Fund.

I was the catalyst for transitioning the local Ministerial Association (comprised of the local pastors of Dallas Center) into a 501c3 non-profit with the purpose of building community, helping those in need (financially and otherwise), and connecting people with resources and aid available to them.

I served on the Presbytery Worship Team (planning Presbytery worship services), the Congregational Health Task Force (building relationships between Presbytery and the local churches), the Presbytery Youth and Camping Team, and the Mission Co-Worker search team for the Our Sister Parish ministry of the Presbytery of Des Moines. I served as a guest preacher for Presbytery meetings, a guest speaker for two other Presbyterian Church officer retreats, and participated in a weekly lectionary study group. I recently completed a Doctor of Ministry degree with a focus in Church Revitalization at McCormick Seminary in Chicago where my doctoral thesis received the John Randall Hunt Prize for Outstanding D.Min. Thesis. My research centered on our inherent call as God's royal priesthood through the lens of a Trinitarian ecclesiology. It was through this theological frame that I sought to build and develop trusting relationships within the community. In the growing and diversifying congregation I served, the adaptive challenge we sought to address was developing community in a constantly changing system.

I love audio books, cycling, weight lifting, and movies. I love spending time with my kiddos and my wife, being outdoors, and coffee! I love serving the church, shepherding with and for God's people, Bible study and discussion, and exploring new ways to be about the gospel of Jesus Christ in our changing world. I love both traditional and contemporary church liturgy and music, am a guitarist and vocalist, and love using technology to augment ministry.

My wife, Sarah, is an instrumental music teacher and also a talented figure skater and coach. Sarah has also been active in the church all her life as her father served as a Navy Chaplain and Baptist Minister. Sarah grew up in Ridgecrest, CA where her father was stationed at the Naval Air Weapons Base.

Our kiddos have also taken up figure skating with their mom. Their sense of balance and grace seems to defy gravity! I, on the other hand, cannot stay upright on ice, so I have become the family cheerleader watching my family excel in their sport but from a safe distance.

Our oldest, Aaron is in sixth grade and is 12 years old. He plays clarinet in band, plays violin, and loves Star Wars, and of course video games. Kaydence is in fifth grade and just turned 11. She loves figure skating and has excelled so much in the last few years. She is a star on the ice and is so good at expressing herself through her skating! She plays the flute in band and loves singing. Our youngest, Zachary, is in third grade and is 8 years old. He has the biggest heart I've ever seen in a kiddo and has the broadest imagination. ExtraFood Volunteer Opportunity



ExtraFood is a Marin nonprofit food-delivery service transporting unused but still edible food from stores and restaurants to local charitable organizations. There is a great need for drivers, and the organization would appreciate your help!! They need drivers to deliver food as they are expanding their service area in Novato. Once volunteers are trained, they can sign up for specific delivery routes that fit their personal schedules. ExtraFood hopes for a commitment of one shift per month but encourages more if possible.

Orientation:

Training consists of a one-hour orientation on how their system works along with important food-handling rules. If you can attend, ExtraFood will need to see your driver's license, vehicle registration and car insurance front-page summary. For your convenience, they have scheduled an orientation session at PCN on Tuesday, March 12th at 10 a.m. in the Christensen Room. More Than 100 Men Rescued from Somalia

Agape International Missions (AIM) has long been involved in combating human trafficking. They have broadened their scope of work to include those forced to work on fishing boats. In the fall of 2018, Cambodian law-enforcement officials and the AIM SWAT team learned that more than 100 Cambodian men were being forced to work on fishing boats off the coast of Somalia. The victims were poorly treated, worked in abusive conditions, and were paid very little, if at all.

AIM SWAT has already assisted in repatriating 50 of the rescued men back to Cambodia and is working to repatriate the remaining victims. After helpful interviews with each victim, two suspects were arrested and charged with human-trafficking related crimes. AIM's legal team will represent the rescued men in this trial free of charge and will continue to work with the police to provide aftercare and employment for each of these brave men.

Dear Carolyn,

Salaam Alekum (Peace to you) from South Sudan! How are you? We are excited to share some testimonies from a healing and reconciliation workshop in rural South Sudan in our current newsletter (below).

[Current Newsletter: Standing in the Gap](#)

I (Kristi) knelt on a mat facing the gathering of men and women of the Anywaa people. I spoke, confessing and acknowledging ways that my ancestors, my people, had hurt the Anywaa tribe. "My ancestors are Europeans, and they decided boundaries without regard for the boundaries of tribes and kingdoms that already existed; your tribe was divided between Ethiopia and Sudan." I continued with confessions on behalf of Americans and missionaries, including our country's purchase of slaves that perpetuated the prejudice against Africans and disrespect for their personhood and societies. I could feel the emotion, remorse and guilt, knowing that they had been considered disposable and backward, and that their colonizing government had not invested in education and development for their communities. Some people closed their eyes, not wanting to face me or the emotion welling up in them;



Aging with Independence and Navigating Long-Term Care

Stephen Ministry will be offering a two-part class this April on “Aging with Independence” and “Navigating Long-Term Care.” The classes will be offered on Tuesday, April 23 and Tuesday, April 30 from 7 to 9 p.m. in the Christensen Room.

The topics to be discussed include:

Day 1) Aging with independence: what’s my plan?

- How do we prepare for a healthy and happy late life?
building resilience; strengthening our connections
- Community resources: recreational, spiritual and social connections; special needs; transportation
- Avoiding risk: legal protections, fall prevention, polypharmacy, communication with medical providers
- Options for in-home assistance

Day 2) Navigating long-term care

- Levels of care: independent living, assisted living and dementia care; skilled nursing and rehabilitation
- How is it funded: Medicare/Medi-Cal, long-term care insurance, reverse mortgage
- Discussion (sharing our thoughts): How do we best support our parent/spouse/friend? How do we best support the family caregiver?

After earning a graduate degree in gerontology, she worked as a nursing home administrator, geriatric care manager, and with families in assisted living and dementia care communities. Mission Projects:


- (1) **Least Coin Offering:** Since 1956, Presbyterian Women have been collecting the Least Coin worldwide for evangelism, service, and relief projects.


