#### "One of the Greatest Joys of My Life"

I remember early on a Monday morning being in the sanctuary of the church I served. I was the only one at the church. There was a great storm raging outside. Thunder was shaking the walls and the stained-glass windows. Yet, as was my spiritual practice, I sat in the second-row pew, two seats over, right where Sue always sat on Sunday morning. Every Monday, I came in first thing and sat in the seat where one of my parishioners would always sit, and I prayed for them.

On this day, I remember finishing my prayer and getting up to walk over to my office but felt the need to stop. I turned and faced the stage area looking at the cross all the while listening to the storm howling and booming around me. And I did something I'd never, in my life, even thought about doing. I was compelled, pushed, led even to walk up to the front of the sanctuary before the cross and kneel down. And once down it didn't feel like enough, like I had done what I came to do. I remember laying down prostrate, nose to the floor, before Christ.

And there, I prayed – words that just poured from me, "God, I am yours. Lead me and I will follow." I'm sure had anyone walked in at that moment I would have looked ridiculous, or perhaps they would have run up to make sure I was still breathing. But in that moment I felt a deep connection with Jesus...so deep, in fact, that I couldn't help but offer my whole self, once again, to be Christ's disciple.

Sometimes, when the congregations I serve do their annual pledge drives, I remember back to that day, when Jesus taught me that giving of myself is not a burden but is instead one of the greatest joys of my life. I don't feel compelled to give of myself anymore out of some duty or obligation, and certainly not because of catchy campaign slogans. I give of who I am, including pledging financial resources, because I want to be about what God is up to. I want to join in God's love song with the meager offerings I can give so that I can be about it...so that God can take what I have and build the kingdom of God here and now.

Yeah, I care about church initiatives, projects, experiments, and yes, vision for the future. I want my giving to be used wisely....but what I've learned over the years is that God has a way of fulfilling God's plans sometimes in spite of all we think we have figured out. My trust is in God.

This year is no different. I trust in God.

"God, I am yours. Lead me and I will follow."

As you consider your financial pledge this year, I know there are a lot of considerations. We are coming off a terrible pandemic. Some have been without work. Others are on fixed incomes. Some are not clear on the direction the church is taking in this post-pandemic world. How will my financial contribution be used? What if I don't like all the pieces of the vision that the Session has brought forth?

These are important considerations. But I will say, too, that our pledges have more to do with God's love playing out in our lives than they do about anything else. We give because God first gave to us. We give extravagantly because the extravagant grace of Jesus Christ saved us and continues to rescue us even today.

I know without a shadow of a doubt that Christ is at work in the Presbyterian Church of Novato, leading us, guiding us, equipping us, transforming lives, meeting needs, and loving beyond measure. We will continue to seek to live into the fullness of who we are as a congregation, not change who we are.

If you're like me at the moment of writing this article, maybe you have not yet finalized your pledge for 2022. As God leads us into this next year, I encourage you to consider not only increasing your financial giving in the life and ministry of PCN, but also of your time and energy. But don't do it expecting some specified, personalized result. Instead, do it to see what God can and will do with more of you in the mix. After all, you are a vital piece of who we are as a church.

What will God do with us in 2022? Every year I embrace the new year, not with fear, but with the hope of Jesus Christ that is our guiding light.

I encourage you to join me in the profound and life-changing profession: "God, I am yours. Lead me and I will follow."

# 2021 Alternative Christmas Faire

There are many organizations that are in need of help, and we know that the congregation has stepped up to help out for many years to support the organizations sponsored by PCN.

The Mission Committee is organizing a "Virtual Alternative Christmas Faire" event that will be presented from November 22nd through December 12th. The "in-person" event is scheduled for December 12th following the church service(s). The following organizations are included in the Alternative Christmas Faire.

**Homeward Bound** - provides housing, training and hope to end homelessness. For more information visit their website at <a href="https://www.hbofm.org">www.hbofm.org</a>. You can support Homeward Bound by ordering Halo Holiday Gifts.

**Alchemia** - Alchemia nurtures the creative expression of individuals with disabilities as a vehicle for personal growth and accomplishment. The vision of Alchemia is for a future in which all people with disabilities are valued and contributing members of society.

Marin Shakespeare Company – On stage, in schools, in prisons, and online, Marin Shakespeare Company brings people together to learn from the past and imagine the future, and spark cultural engagement, learning, and social change through the arts. Marin Shakespeare has a program that helps people previously incarcerated. In addition, they have a program that has been used for elementary children at Lynwood Elementary.

**The Street Chaplaincy** - The Street Chaplaincy visits homeless persons where they are most often found, on the streets, at the shelters, motels, encampments, hospitals, nursing facilities, and county jail. They accompany the homeless and support them by helping the unsheltered find financial assistance, housing, and medical care by connecting them with city/county programs, healthcare providers and local service organizations.

**Lynwood 'Maker Space'** - The vision for the program is to focus on STREAM activities (Science, Technology, Relationships, Engineering, Art, and Math) that allow time and space for students to create, tinker, learn how to do something new, problem solve, and take risks. Maker Space provides a safe and supportive space that inspires children to be challenged, creative, innovative and collaborative, all skills needed for a 21<sup>st</sup> century world.

**Heifer Project** - provides a seed investment of livestock or agriculture, followed by mentorship to help project participants build a business, and ultimately to gain access to supply chains and markets.

## Stay Healthy Novato

The best way to **reduce the risk** of becoming infected with a respiratory virus, whether the flu or coronavirus, is to practice good hygiene:

- Get your COVID-19 vaccine. More information at getvaccinatedmarin.com.
- Wear a face covering.
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially before eating, after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer when soap and water is not available.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue or crook of your elbow (not your hands). If you use a tissue, throw it away and wash your hands afterward.
- Avoid touching your face.
- Stay home from work or school if you have a fever or are feeling sick.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe. If you use wipes: remember to either throw (or bag and throw) the used wipes into the trash and NOT into the toilet. Wipes (even if labeled "flushable") can clog your toilets, the sewer pipe (private lateral) from your house to the public street sewer, or the public street sewers, and could result in additional health and safety issues.
