The Women's Bible Study will resume its Bible Study in the New Year on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>January 5</u>, <u>2023</u> beginning at **10 a.m.** (new start time) and <u>conclude at 11:30 a.m.</u> We would like to extend an invitation to all ladies of the congregation to come and join us on Zoom as we being our in-depth study of the <u>Gospel of John</u>. We will begin our study on page 19 of our study guide, "*Life Change*."

As we begin our study in the *Gospel of John*, we see that John borrowed language from the opening lines of Genesis to help us understand the prehistory of Jesus. He existed as the eternal Logos (word, message) before he was born in Bethlehem.

The phrase *the Word was with God* indicates a distinction between the Word and God; at the same time, the phrase *the Word was* God indicates unity. Christian belief in the deity of Jesus as the Son of God does not mean that Christians believe in two gods. There is only one God, and the preexistent Christ is an essential part of God in ways we cannot fully understand (1 Corinthians 8:6).

Jesus is creator and also illuminator. The word translated **overcome** can also mean "understood." The forces of darkness can neither fathom nor defeat the light of Jesus. The light of the Word will shine in the most depraved human conditions. Light always trumps darkness.

The power of the enlightening message of Jesus is in the splendor of the **truth it reveals**. This message of God's love and salvation for all humankind is one of grace (John 3:17).

COMING IN JANUARY: "GOD'S PROMISES"

In January we will be looking at God's promises in the Old Testament with lessons from 2 Chronicles, Isaiah, and Joel that remind us to hear prayers of repentance and to be present and see how God restores His people after times of distress.

God identified himself as the creator, and then spoke the substance of his message: **Do not fear.** God explained why Israel should not fear: (1) **I have redeemed you.** The Lord owned Israel because he created Israel. But Israel had been captured and enslaved by its own son. So the Lord redeemed the people (bought them back). Although Babylonian captivity was still in their future, the Lord's rescue was so certain that he spoke of redemption in the past tense. (2) God **summoned you by name.** There could be no question about whom God redeemed. (3) God states the result, or effect of his redemption: **You are mine.** How could Israel be afraid of anything?

God proclaimed his faithful presence – even in frightening or painful situations – and declared himself *the Savior*. God affirmed his love for his people; he promised to gather again those who would be scattered. He also challenged the pagan world to produce *witnesses* to prove that anyone among them had foretold future events as God had done. Then God himself names his own *witnesses*. His point is made abundantly clear: *there is no savior other than the one true God. He is eternal, all-powerful, and sovereign over all.*

God is your creator, redeemer, and protector. How can this knowledge help you navigate tough times? Come and join a great conversation.

Find information on being prepared. Every disaster, whether it affects one person or millions, has one thing in common...it is disruptive. The greater the impact, the more it disrupts those things we depend upon and often take for granted. Universal emergency or disaster education and preparedness means everyone, regardless of age or circumstance, needs to devote the time, resources and energy to understand and benefit from being "ready" for any type of an emergency.

Have you picked up your Evacuation Tag yet?

The Novato Police Department and Novato Fire Protection District are giving away evacuation tags to residents living in the City of Novato. Evacuation tags are a new tool to help us quickly ensure that neighborhoods are evacuated during a disaster. Hang the tag in a location that is highly visible from the street when they evacuate (mailbox, front door, garage, end of your driveway). This saves time and effort which we need to immediately check the next home. We have learned that seconds can count during evacuations, and we are excited to bring this new life-saving tool to our residents. Each tag comes with an instruction flyer in English and Spanish.

Updated (Omicron) Booster Information

Marin County Public Health strongly recommends the new booster for anyone age 50 and older.

- As new variants emerged, the booster was updated to **improve protection** against currently circulating variants.
- The updated booster strengthens protection against the newer Omicron variants, which account for most of the current cases.
- Everyone 12 and older who has had their primary series can get the updated booster.
 - Pfizer: 12 years of age and older.
 Moderna: 18 years of age and older.
- 2 months after your last dose (including the booster).
- It is recommended to get the updated booster 2 months after a COVID infection
- You can "mix and match" no matter which vaccine you received for your primary series and prior booster doses. Mixing vaccines may enhance the immune response, and it increases flexibility in case the vaccine you initially received is not available.
