"Faithful Experimentation"

I loved science as a kid. I loved discovering how the building blocks of everything worked, how combinations of elements created new elements, and how knowing the properties of the smallest things could lead to the creation of new, complex things. But one of my favorite things about science was the inclusion of labs and experiments. I loved getting away from the book, from the memorization, and actually trying something out, seeing what the result might be, reflecting on what happened, and creating new experiments.

My favorite experiments were the ones in which we were not told what the outcomes would be. These experiments required educated guessing on our part, hypothesizing as to what outcome might be probable. And then we would do the experiment. Sometimes the hypothesis proved to be true, but other times the experiment would result in something unexpected. It might even look like it failed miserably. And we'd be forced to admit, "Well, that was fascinating!" And we would have to ask, "Why did that happen?" The experiment would teach us something new, something that could help us learn and grow for future experiments.

In many ways, PCN is going into 2022 prepped and ready to journey into the wilderness. The world has kept changing around us. A pandemic lingers. People aren't joining churches like they used to. We are going into an unknown future seeking to be faithful to Christ, worshiping together, sharing the gospel, building up the body of Christ, and serving those in need. But in the wilderness, there is no certainty. The patterns and models of ministry we have been accustomed to may or may not serve the purposes they used to serve. We may be in need of revising those patterns or learning new patterns that serve to live into our call.

You see the wilderness is a place of faithful experimentation. We don't have it all figured out, much like our brothers and sisters who journeyed through the wilderness following their escape from slavery in Egypt. They had to experiment, learn, struggle, adapt, trust in God more and more. And we, too, are having to learn together new practices and patterns of faithful discipleship in the wilderness: discipleship that welcomes and invites our neighbors into worship and community, that bridges cultural divides, that makes the gospel message accessible to a new generation. And the only

way to learn and grow is to experiment; to faithfully try new things, take risks, boldly go in directions previously untaken.

And some of these experiments will have the result we hope for. Others will fail. Others will have unexpected consequences. And all the while we will learn something new, something about the wilderness, something about how we are called to move.

In this wilderness we will have to be agile, adaptable, creative and imaginative. We will have to think and move outside the box, learn to grow accustomed to change, collaborate with and care for one another. We will have to be loving, forgiving, patient, and kind. We will have to lean on God more and more knowing that the promised land, while not in sight, is on the horizon.

This coming year, we will be working to "Building Connections in Christ." We will create a new life group ministry that intentionally connects our members and visitors, expands our communication, and connects to the life and ministry of the church. We will be seeking staff to help administer this new ministry initiative. We will be working to build up our communications to help boost PCN's visibility and presence within the community. We will be developing and expanding our focus on Emergency Response. We will be reforming our leadership model to reflect a more collaborative and agile approach to leadership.

This will be a year of hope-filled action, trying new things, and learning as we go. It is exciting and scary all at the same time. But we move in this direction putting our trust in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Blessings to you, dear saints, as we embark on this journey together.



Two Cents a Meal* Asks for Your Support

The Presbytery of the Redwoods Hunger Task Force has been hard at work this year, reviewing grant requests and funding 21 timely, creative, and necessary projects. Through your contributions and by



God's grace, we have awarded \$29,425.00 to date to support hunger alleviation projects in our communities. This represents an increase of more than \$10,000 compared to the amount we granted in 2020 (\$18,675.00) Some of our 2021 grantees are:

Community Presbyterian Church, Vallejo which received \$2,500 on behalf of Rebuilding Together Solano County to provide fruits, vegetables, protein and non-perishables to low-income families, veterans, seniors, and disabled individuals in Solano County.

Church of the Roses, Santa Rosa which received \$2,000 to provide a daily free, hot, nutritious breakfast to Montgomery High

School students in Santa Rosa with intentions of boosting academic performance and curbing low school attendance while providing students a safe place to gather before school.

Presbyterian Church of Novato, Novato which received \$1,000 to provide gift cards for groceries for individuals participating in The Showers at Novato, a mobile shower program for those in Marin County.

Presbyterian Church of the Redeemer, Fortuna which received \$4,250 on behalf of 2 community-based partners (River Life Foundation and St. Joseph's Food Pantry) to provide holiday meals and canned goods to the Humboldt County/Redwood Empire community along the North Coast.

The Hunger Task Force expects to receive additional applications for hunger relief projects in our Presbytery before December 31, 2021, but our current account balance is **\$1,065.83**. We will not be able to fully support requests for these life-changing projects or begin 2022 ready to support requests received in January without your continued financial support.

While David's kingdom was not perfect (far from it, as we shall see), in his reign something of the characters of the kingdom of God was on display. King David "did justice and righteousness for all his people."

However, what we are about to see in 2 Samuel is astonishing. It is not what most of us would expect in a kingdom of "justice and righteousness."

In the next quarter of the Sunday Morning Adult Study Group, we will be studying "Justice, Law, History" from books of the Old Testament: Pentateuch, 2 Samuel, Ezra, Job, Isaiah, and Nahum.

Quarterly Preview:

Justice originates in the nature of God and is given to God's people as a gift under the Law. Unit 1 explores how David demonstrates justice by showing kindness to Mephibosheth. Isaiah describes a reign of justice and righteousness through the Messiah, while Nahum shows God's justice to Judah's enemies.

Unit 2 focuses on God's justice in the face of human injustice, with stories about Cain's murder of Abel as well as the plight of Hagar and Ishmael. Exodus and Deuteronomy discuss how judges, officials, and priests work together to administer justice for all.

Unit 3 deals with situations in which justice seems absent such as David's injustice toward Uriah, and when Ezra determines to restore respect for God's Law. Scriptures from Job question the presence of God's justice when Job suffered greatly.


